



Itinerary

DAY ONE: (TUESDAY FEB. 21) DEPARTURE AND TRAVEL

Your Pilgrimage begins today with your flight to Israel.

DAY TWO: (WEDNESDAY FEB. 22) TEL AVIV

Today we will arrive at the Tel Aviv International Airport. After collecting our baggage, we will be shuttled to the hotel. Dinner and overnight accommodations will be at the West Lagoon (or something similar) in Netanya.

DAY THREE: (THURSDAY FEB. 23) MEDITERRANEAN SEA | GALILEE

Our first stop today is Caesarea, the ancient Roman seaport capital where the first gentile was baptized. Here, we will tour the Roman aqueduct, restored theatre, Herod's palace and Crusader city. Next on our tour is Mt. Carmel which overlooks the Mediterranean Sea and Jezreel Valley. This is where Prophet Elijah called upon the fire of God to conquer the Prophets of Baal. From there we proceed to Megiddo and the town of Armageddon, the Strategically Old Testament town located on the main routes between Babylonia and Egypt. Our last stop for the day will be Kefar Kedem near Nazareth. This site brings to life a Galilean village and its rural surrounding from 2000 years ago. Tonight's overnight accommodations will be at a Sea of Galilee Hotel or Ginosar (similar).

DAY FOUR: (FRIDAY FEB. 24) SEA OF GALILEE

Today's pilgrimage begins with the Ancient Boat Museum where you will see the preserved fishing boats from the days of Jesus. Next up is Capernaum, the base of Jesus' Galilee Ministry! Here, he found his disciples, healed the sick, preached in the synagogue, and performed miracles. We then move to the Mount of Beatitudes, the hill where Jesus delivered his Sermon on the Mount. Enjoy the peace and tranquility and walk down to the lake (Matthew 5). Migdal (Magdala) is our next stop. This Jewish town was recently excavated along with the Synagogue from the time of Jesus. Korazim's ancient Synagogue and Jewish town is next on today's journey. Jesus rebuked the town for the lack of faith and for spurning his miracles. Our final stop today will be Bethsaida, "The House of the Fisherman," home of Peter, Philip and Andrew. Tonight's overnight accommodations will be at a Sea of Galilee Hotel or Ginosar (similar).

DAY FIVE: (SATURDAY FEB. 25) UPPER GALILEE | GOLAN

We begin our day in Golan Heights, where we will overview Syria and learn the strategic importance of the Golan. Next is our overview of Lebanon before moving on to Tel Dan, a beautiful biblical site where we will walk around one of the rivers feeding the Jordan. Next on our journey is Caesarea Philippi, the city of the goat footed God Pan. It was here that Jesus revealed to his disciples who he was. Then we will move on to Mt. Hermon or the Mountain of Transfiguration where we will learn the strategic importance of this highest mountain. Finally, we will take a boat ride and have a time of fellowship on the Sea of Galilee. Tonight's overnight

accommodations will be at a Sea of Galilee Hotel or Ginosar (similar).

DAY SIX: (SUNDAY FEB. 26) GALILEE | DEAD SEA

This morning we make our way to the Jordan River where we will visit the famous Baptismal site where St. John the Baptist baptized our Lord. Next, we'll travel to Beit She'an, where after losing in battle to the Philistines, king Saul and his sons were hung from the city walls. This is one of the 10 cities in the Decapolis, and the largest of Israel's archeological digs. The ancient city offers a fabulous insight into roman life and times. From there, we move on to Jericho, also called "City of Palms," which is the oldest and lowest city in the world. Next up is Qumran, where we will visit the excavated site and view the location where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found. Today you will have a free afternoon at the Dead Sea to do as you wish. Tonight's overnight accommodations will be available at Herods Hotel (or somewhere similar) on the Dead Sea.

DAY SEVEN: (MONDAY FEB. 27) DEAD SEA - BETHLEHEM | JERUSALEM

This morning we will visit Masada, Herod's Mountain top palace and fortress. We will learn about the last Jewish stand against the Romans and the mass suicide of the Jewish defenders. Next, we will visit the Bethlehem Olive wood Souvenir Shop before moving on to Bethlehem Nativity Church, the ancient church and traditional birth place of Jesus. Shepherds Fields will be our next stop. It is identified as the place where the Angel of the Lord informed the shepherds of Jesus birth. Tonight's overnight accommodations will be available at the Inbal Hotel in Jerusalem (or somewhere similar).

DAY EIGHT: (TUESDAY FEB. 28) JERUSALEM

Today's tour will include some of the most recognizable sites in Jerusalem. First, is the Temple Mt, or Mount Moriah, where Abraham almost sacrificed his only son. It is also the site of the first and second Temples, where Jesus conflicted with the Sadducees. Next, we will visit the Western Wall, or "The Wailing Wall," the holiest place for the Jews. Some may wish to leave a personal note in the crevices of the wall. This afternoon we will also see the southern temple area and Davidson center, the South wall excavations, Southern steps, Gates of the Temple, and an examination of the City of David. Our next stop will be in the heart of the Judean desert, known as the land of the Patriarchs or "Genesis

Land." Eliezer will lead you on camels to Abraham's tent where you will experience his legendary hospitality. Tonight's overnight accommodations will be available at the Inbal Hotel in Jerusalem (or somewhere similar).

DAY NINE: (WEDNESDAY MAR. 1) JERUSALEM

Today, we continue to see some of Jerusalem's most famous and historical sites. First up is St. Peter Galicantu and its great church located on the eastern slope of Mt. Zion. This is where Peter denied our Lord three times. Next, we will visit the Upper Room, site of the Last Supper and the Pentecost epiphany. From there we move on to Herodium, King Herod's magnificent palace fortress and tomb south of Bethlehem. Next, at the Shrine of the Book, we can see many original fragments of the Dead Sea scrolls. We will also view the Israeli Museum Model, a fabulous reconstruction of Herodian Jerusalem and Temple that will enable us to better understand Jerusalem from time of Jesus. We then travel to see Yad Vashem, Israel's national monument, memorial, and museum to the Holocaust. Tonight's overnight accommodations will be available at the Inbal Hotel in Jerusalem (or somewhere similar).

DAY TEN: (THURSDAY MAR. 2) JERUSALEM

This morning, we will have a fabulous view of Jerusalem from the Mount of Olives. From here, we will walk along a similar path that Jesus took when entering the city on Palm Sunday. Next up is the Garden of Gethsemane, where Jesus prayed at the Rock of Agony and was later arrested. Next are the Pools of Bethesda, where Jesus healed the paralytic. We then experience the Via Dolorosa and visit the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. On the grounds of tradition alone, it is the best candidate for the location of crucifixion and the tomb of Jesus. Finally, we will visit the traditional site of the Garden Tomb. Many believe that this was the actual garden of Joseph of Arimathea. Tonight's overnight accommodations will be available at the Inbal Hotel in Jerusalem (or somewhere similar).

DAY ELEVEN: (FRIDAY MAR. 3) TEL AVIV | USA

We will travel to the airport to board our return flight home.
